Ignatz Waghalter was a noted conductor-composer in Europe until he was banned by the Nazis because of his Jewish ancestry. He wrote the anti-fascist opera *Ahaseverus und Ester* and his daughter, Beatrice, sang the role of Ester. David Green, the grandson of Ignatz Waghalter, will join Dr. Laurence Sherr to provide concert commentary.

Songs Not Silenced: Music Forbidden in the Holocaust is a concert featuring five composers whose work was forbidden during the Holocaust. Listen to an excerpt from a performance recorded in New York in 1941 of Waghalter's opera *Ahaseverus und Ester* at the dramatic moment when Ester tells Ahaseverus that she is a Jew at MusicKSU.com.
